PRESENTATION

Human trafficking, along with drug trafficking and the arms trade, are the most lucrative crimes in the world, with an estimated two million children and adolescents being victims of this crime. **TRAFFICKING** is the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or receipt of persons, by means of the threat or use of force or other forms of coercion, abduction, fraud, deception, abuse of power or of a position of vulnerability or of the giving or receiving of payments or benefits to achieve the consent of a person having control over another person, for the purpose of exploitation.

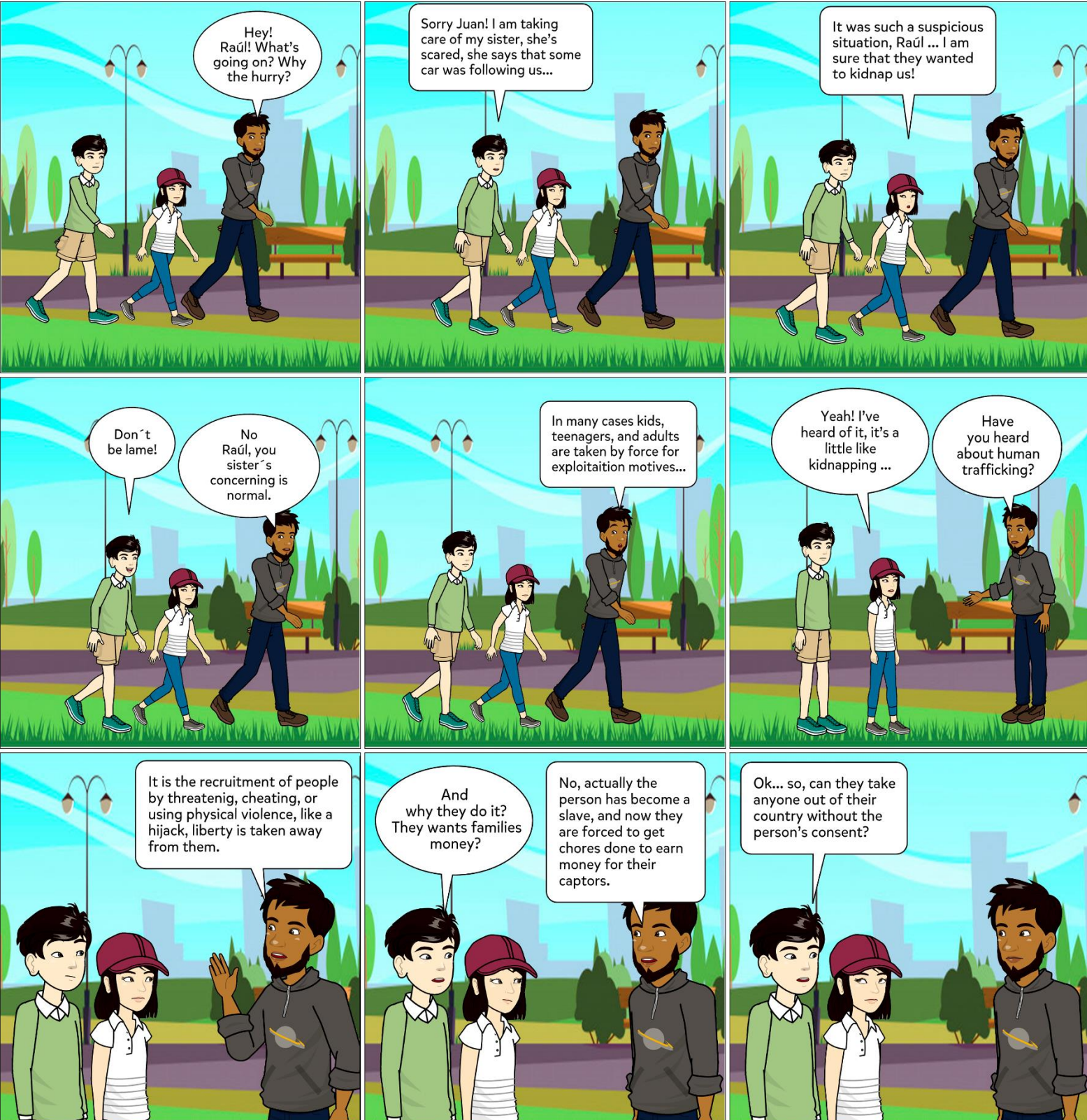
“Don't DEAL with DEALers” is a training and awareness-raising initiative that we propose in response to the urgent need to make visible and raise awareness of the problem of labor and sex trafficking, which affects women, men and young people regardless of their origin.

The following material has been created with the objective of being used as a didactic tool by teachers and counselors in educational centers in Seville, to create spaces for reflection on human trafficking in their classroom activities. Key information about trafficking has been developed in comic format, based on everyday situations with which young people can identify.

At **Foundation Sevilla Acoge** we are convinced that training and awareness-raising on this issue are of vital importance so that young people from all backgrounds have the tools and resources to protect themselves from this type of exploitation.

What is human trafficking?

Always be alert!



Absolutely! When the hijack happens inside of the victim's natal country it is called Intern human trafficking.

On the other hand, Human Trafficking External occurs when the victim is taken away from their natal country by force or false promises that the person can't realize from a first sight.

Juan explains Raúl and his sister that human trafficking has 3 stages. First the victim's manipulation (It can be psychological or physically violent), then the movement happens (Intern or Extern). Finally exploitation, when forced tasks take place.

And... what kind of tasks are these people forced to do?

Mostly sexual exploitation, slavery, or even organ trafficking.

What a nightmare! Next time I'll be the one that get's alarmed, and runs rapidly if any suspicious situation is seen.

Ok guys... the important thing is for you to know more about this topic and how to take care of yourself, so none of these things will ever happen to you.

Panel 10: Thank's Mario! I am so relieved... I didn't know who to talk to about this.

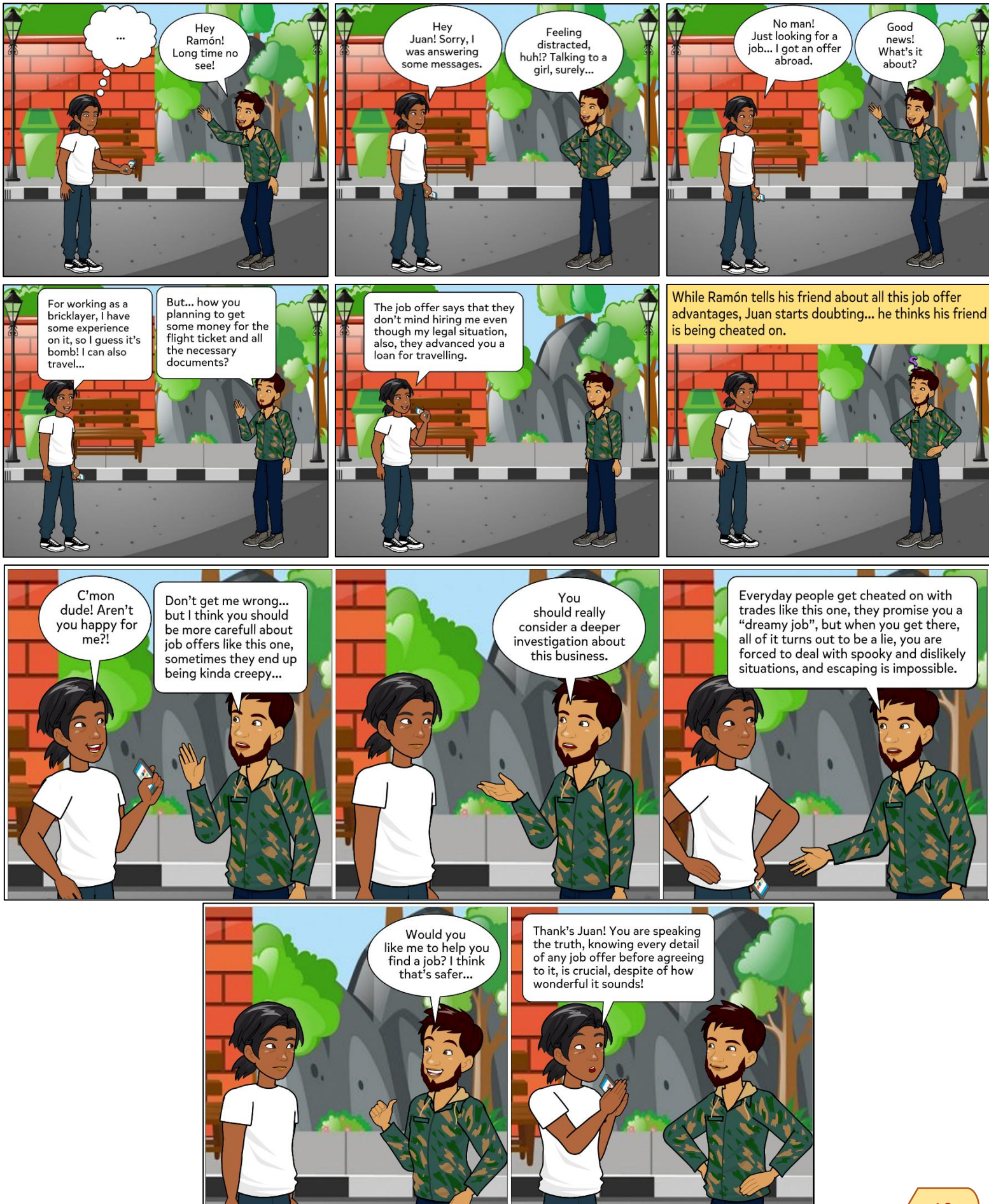

You're probably wondering if there's any way to protect yourself and the ones you love from these threats ... Let's give you some tips and tools to prevent human trafficking!



Find someone of your trust to talk to if any suspicious situation takes place. It can be a relative, a friend or any of your school's authorities.



Be especially careful when dealing with strangers. If anything seems suspicious (personal data requests, odd job offers), don't hesitate talking to a trustworthy person.



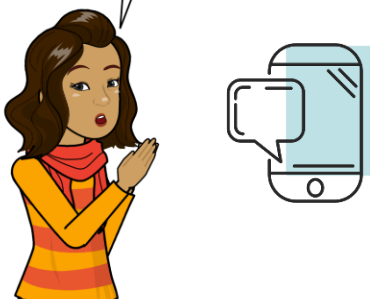
If you're economically vulnerable, look for verified social-assistance alternatives, such as NGOs, public subsidies, etc.)



When applying for a job vacancy, verify the company's info before sending your personal data or attending a job meeting. Many dealers use as a kidnapping strategy misleading job offers.



Make use of social networks responsibly. Do not accept unknown or suspicious friend requests... Be careful about the things you post in the media!



It is important for you to know about local entities to seek help if a situation like this arises (police, your country's consulate, NGOs, etc.)
