PRESENTATION


Human trafficking, along with drug trafficking and the arms trade, are the most lucrative crimes in the world, with an estimated two million children and adolescents being victims of this crime. TRAFFICKING is the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or receipt of persons, by means of the threat or use of force or other forms of coercion, abduction, fraud, deception, abuse of power or of a position of vulnerability or of the giving or receiving of payments or benefits to achieve the consent of a person having control over another person, for the purpose of exploitation.


"Don't DEAL with DEALers" is a training and awareness-raising initiative that we propose in response to the urgent need to make visible and raise awareness of the problem of labor and sex trafficking, which affects women, men and young people regardless of their origin.

The following material has been created with the objective of being used as a didactic tool by teachers and counselors in educational centers in Seville, to create spaces for reflection on human trafficking in their classroom activities. Key information about trafficking has been developed in comic format, based on everyday situations with which young people can identify.

At **Foundation Sevilla Acoge** we are convinced that training and awareness-raising on this issue are of vital importance so that young people from all backgrounds have the tools and resources to protect themselves from this type of exploitation.






